Re: Business Office Update

Date: April 18th, 2022

For the month of March 2022, the Education Fund and the Operations and Maintenance Funds report is as follows. The Education fund revenues were \$7.65 million and Education fund expenditures totaled \$11 million; expenditures exceeded revenues by \$3.35 million. The YTD Ed Fund revenues have exceeded the expenditures by \$4.7 million dollars.

The Operations and Maintenance fund revenues were just under \$72k thousand and expenditures were \$1.65 million; expenditures exceed revenues by \$1.58 million. The YTD O&M Fund expenditures have exceeded revenues by \$4.68M dollars.

For the Investment Balances Report, as of March 31st, the District had a combined cash balance of \$49.9 million in the bank for all funds. For the operating funds only (ED, O&M, Transportation, & Working Cash), total cash in the bank was \$17.59 million. Total investments were \$120.5 million. Earned interest on all cash accounts for the month was just over \$284K. The interest rate on all cash accounts on March 31st was 0.4%.

The total balance of cash and investments for all funds as of March 31st, 2022, was \$170.46 million. For operating funds only, the balance was \$17.59 million.

The district also shows County sales tax proceeds received during the month of March as \$1.25 million dollars for December collections. Total collections thus far for FY22 are \$9.75 million and total collections of just over \$27 million.
